At the outset, the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor welcomed all the members of Task Force and other officials of Hostel and Health Centre.

The matter of opening of the University was deliberated in view of Haryana State Disaster Management Authority order no. DMC-SPO-2020/9818 dated 05.09.2021, Guidelines issued by Ministry of Health and Family Welfare dated 25.08.2021, Ministry of Home Affairs order No. 40-3/2020-DM-I (A) dated 28.08.2021 and order No. 1580/MA dated 06-09-2021 issued by District Magistrate-cum-Chairman, DDMA, Mahendergarh at Narnaul.

The agenda points discussed and resolved are given below:

- 1) The Task Force discussed and resolved that the online teaching may continue till 15.10.2021 as per the guidelines issued by Haryana State Disaster Management Authority for all UP/PG/ Research Programmes.
- 2) The University will remain open for Research Scholars of all the Departments accessing library/research facilities, laboratory work, practicals, research work, consultation with supervisor etc. with strict adherence of requisite social distancing norms, regular Covid appropriate behavioral norms, the guidelines as indicated in the SOPs released by Ministry of Health Welfare from 09:00 AM to 06:00 PM.
- 3) The UP/PG students of the following programs are allowed to attend the doubt classes, practical classes in laboratories, practical examinations and off-line examinations from 20th September 2021 onwards:

Biochemistry, Biotechnology, Chemistry, Mathematics, Microbiology, Nutrition Biology, Physics, Pharmaceutical Science, Environmental Studies, Library & Information Science, Yoga, Computer Science & Engineering, Electrical Engineering, Civil Engineering, Printing & Packaging Technology, B.Voc. – Retail & Logistics Management, B.Voc. Biomedical Sciences, B.Voc.-Industrial Waste Management, Physical Education & Sports, Journalism and Mass Communication (JMC), Department of Tourism & Hotel Management (DTHM) and Department of Computer Science and Information Technology.

The concerned departments shall ensure that the students assume Covid-19 appropriate behavioral norms with strict adherence of requisite social distancing norms, the guidelines as indicated in the SOPs released by Ministry of Health and Social Welfare and the order issued by GoI/UGC/State Govt. from time to time.

- 4) Hostel Warden, are advised to make Hostels ready in all aspects before 20th September, 2021 for accommodation of the students arriving at campus for practical classes. The allotment of Hostel will be done keeping in mind COVID-19 protocol. The students will be charged Rs. 500/- for 15 days for hostel expenses and thereafter a multiply after each 15 days.
- 5) The students who are willing to come to University from Kerala, Maharashtra and states other than Haryana where number of Covid-19 active cases are more than 2000 are required to produce RT-PCR/RAT Negative Test done within 72 Hrs. The valid RT-PCR /RAT Negative Report is required to be submitted at the respective departments.
- 6) The Incharge-Health Centre is advised to keep necessary preparations ready for primary care and the Hostel Warden are advised to keep one Isolation Ward in each Hostel as a precautionary measure.
- 7) The concerned department may decide to call as many students to Department as possible so that COVID-19 appropriate behaviour may be followed at any given point of time.
- 8) The task force shall further review its recommendations periodically.
